



Girton Parish Council June/July Highlights

Greater Cambridgeshire Partnership

The Council approved the following: "Girton Parish Council request they be regarded as a primary consultee on all transport plans for Cambridge City, particularly including the current new road classification scheme". By submitting this request to the GCP 2022 consultation, it is hoped Girton PC will be included in all proposals, so Girton is not adversely impacted by any plans to control traffic along the A1307 into the City. Past proposals risk turning Girton into a de facto Park & Ride site for city commuters.

New Citi 5 Bus Stop

Thank you to Oakington and Westwick Parish Council who confirm Oakington Garden Centre is now served by the Citi 5 bus. For safety reasons, it was necessary to install the stop about 100 yards from the garden centre entrance in Dry Drayton Road (near the entrance to Fare Acres Farm).

Girton Recreation Ground - New Litter Bins

Thank you to Full Council, and to SCDC, for approving and fitting two new litter bins/dog poo bins at Girton recreation ground. One at the bottom of the multi-use games area, and one by the Cricket nets. Please make good use of these bins. They are already making this area a much more pleasant place to view people playing sport on the MUGA.

Girton Parish News

The Council was pleased to welcome Rob Neal, Editor of Girton Parish News, to our Full Council meeting to provide more details on the GPN request for funding. Rob is now compiling a business case for the September Full Council.

Finance

Girton Parish Council approved our Annual Governance and Accountability Return (AGAR) at an extraordinary council meeting on 29 June. The AGAR issued met the 1 July deadline, now posted on our Parish website. A finance workshop was held on 20 July to discuss priorities for the GPC 2022/2023 financial calendar.

Girton Feast

Thank you to all of you who visited our Girton Feast market stall. Many councillors took part and were thrilled by the response. A total of 101 suggestions/comments were received from you on the day, and 42 suggestions via our on-line Feast survey. Comments are still coming in. We will aim to publish the information collected in the September edition of the GPN.

FROM OUR COUNCILLORS

District Councillors' Joint Report

This report will cover activities for young people, including funds and help for older residents. Wild Minds is still under-subscribed and, if you're interested, we would recommend that you get in touch.

Summer Holiday Activities and Food (HAF) Programme

Cambridgeshire County Council has asked us to help publicise their summer holiday activities and food (HAF) programme funded by the Department for Education. They have nearly 3,000 free holiday scheme places available. Families in receipt of income-related free school meals can access up to 64 hours per child, including a meal. Ukrainian and other refugee families are eligible.

Wild Minds

This is a free outdoor activity scheme offered by SCDC for young people aged 12 to 17 years old, with two programmes running in August at Milton Country Park and Wandlebury.

Wild Minds was set up in response to the picture of young people's mental health in the UK. Developed in 2019 by SCDC and Cambridge Sport Lakes Trust, it is supported by a Clinical Psychologist and uses the THRIVE model.

- Free outdoor activities in small groups in a park setting.
- To support young people's wellbeing.
- Milton Country Park sessions are for young people aged 15 to 17 years old.
- Wandlebury Country Park sessions are for young people aged 12 to 14 years old.
- A range of outdoor activities to make the most of the natural environment.
- Sessions are weekly, 90 minutes long, for eight weeks.
- The course is run by skilled instructors and youth workers.

Children's Summer Sports Holiday Camp

Still some activities available, and early notice of October half-term events.



Children and Young People Grant Fund

How much, when and who? Grants of £4-£8K, deadline 30 November. Charitable groups, Parish Councils eligible to apply.

Case studies: Mobile youth club and the food truck, sensory garden, restoration of village recreation ground wildlife area.



Help for older residents who are struggling with bills

In March, the Government announced that councils would be provided with funding to continue the Household Support Fund. Cambridgeshire has been allocated £3.58million, of which £1.2m will be used to support households that include a person who has reached state pension age (66) by 30 September 2022. Funding will also be used to continue providing food vouchers for eligible families with children, and the Cambridgeshire Local Assistance Scheme. Under the Household Support Fund, there is funding available via the Council and Age UK to provide financial support, and help people find longer-term support if needed. This financial assistance is available to people born before 30 September 1956. Residents who wish to apply should call Age UK on 01223 221929

In March, the Government announced the extension of the scheme, awarding Cambridgeshire an additional £3.58m to support children, families, and pensioners. The County Council will be offering the following schemes:

- £1.96m for provision of food vouchers with a value of £15 per child per week, for the 2022 May half term and summer holidays. Schools and childcare settings, including childminders, will be contacted directly and eligible parents will be notified.
- £1.2m to support households with a person who has reached state pension age by 30 September 2022 and in financial hardship.
- A boost for other services supporting those in need

Never used a QR Code?

The QR code is a machine-readable code consisting of an array of black and white squares, typically used for storing URL's (internet addresses) or other information for reading by the camera on a smart phone or other device. If your camera is unable to read the codes you may need to download and install a QR Code Reader app. You may also be able to read bar codes in shops or other places if you choose an app that will do both.

Once you have downloaded the app hover it over the code you wish to read to find the results. A simple click on any URL (internet address) displayed will take you to the address shown.

If you have installed the QR reader app use it to read the code above then click on the URL (internet address) this should take you to www.google.co.uk without having to type that lengthy address

An Electric Refuse Collection Fleet for South Cambridgeshire and the City

The end of June marked the arrival of the second fully electric refuse collection vehicle for Greater Cambridge (GC) Shared Waste. This vehicle, an Electra-Rotopress, joins the eCollect, the first electric vehicle to be drafted into the GC fleet in November 2020. The acquisition of electric vehicles fits squarely with the progress of South Cambridgeshire towards a net-zero carbon emissions goal.



The Electra-Rotopress uses a novel rotating screw design to gradually compact the load. The degree of compaction is controlled by the screw. The design is kept simple with the screw being the main moving part, and it is well suited to organic material that is kept aerated and mixed. This compaction method is also more efficient than the system of hydraulic rams normally deployed to compress the load. The Electra-Rotopress is manufactured by Faun-Zoeller (UK) a company in the German-based Kirchoff Group.

The vehicle's battery will be recharged between shifts at the Greater Cambridge's Waterbeach depot where a solar PV farm and bank of batteries will provide the electrical power. Daily rounds of refuse collection with a guaranteed return to the depot for charging puts paid to the "range anxiety" that is a regular feature of discussions about electric vehicles.

We hope that as South Cambs residents you'll begin to benefit from the clean and efficient operation that characterises this fleet.

Wild Girton – Progress with Local Nature Recovery Plan

Building on the public meeting on biodiversity in May, Girton Parish Council set up a joint stall at the Girton Feast with Wildlife Trust BCN (Bedfordshire, Cambridgeshire, and Northamptonshire), to engage further with the community on the development of the Local Nature Recovery Plan. We also led a small, but well-attended nature walk around the Girton Wood, aka the Millennium Wood. It was created by the Woodland Trust to commemorate the Millennium. It's a 2.42hectare broadleaf wood, with mature hedges and some exciting features; but could do with some conservation interventions to enhance its resilience, and biodiversity. Indeed, at the LNRP public meeting in May, it was suggested that it would be great if it had bluebells, though these would need human intervention to flourish there because it isn't an ancient woodland.

One exciting development is the collation of a historical species list for our ward, provided by the Cambridgeshire and Peterborough Environmental Records Centre (CPERC) to the GPC to support work on the Local Nature Recovery Plan. Among several different groups such as:- flowering plants, conifers, insects, birds and 1,884 species have been recorded since 1963 (a full list will be available soon on the GPC website). Whilst impressive, there will probably be more species to record, some species locally extinct due to habitat loss, and others may have moved elsewhere due to climate change.

Using this information and following the initial consultation phase (although we still welcome ideas from you on how to increase and maintain our biodiversity!), we will produce an initial plan for further consultation. This should happen in September, or sooner, and the plan will broadly follow these steps.

- 1. Make a simple map of wildlife habitats.
- 2. Decide the objectives for your nature recovery plan.
- 3. Develop a nature recovery map that illustrates where we want new, or enhanced habitats.
- 4. Develop a timeline.
- 5. Develop a plan for maintaining and monitoring these habitats and the wildlife

Watch this space!

It's a family and friends affair

If only there was a cure, then the future may seem much brighter. The reality is that as yet there is no cure so the challenge is, therefore, how to live with the disease in the most positive way possible.

There are many articles and help sheets one can read to help explain the various ways Alzheimer's may affect the everyday life of the diagnosed. There is also information about how much the carer needs support but accessing practical day to day support is not easy, and a list of dos and don'ts are not necessarily of immediate help.

One thing for sure is that it is not just the person with Alzheimer's that goes through the various stages but the whole family. It may start with the partner but slowly it impacts on various members of the family and friends.

Friends and family can provide an enormous therapeutic role for the carer. They can provide an opportunity for the carer to be part of normal conversations and to attend social gatherings. A nonjudgmental friend can provide the atmosphere where detrimental changes in the diagnosed person's ability to maintain social etiquette is accepted and thus enabling the carer to relax in the knowledge they won't need to step in and provide excuses or apologies.

The Healthy You Falls Prevention Service is a free service funded by Public Health at Cambridgeshire County Council. Our aim is to help prevent falls and fall related injuries.

We offer fall assessments which help identify fall risks before they become a problem. If fall risks are identified, a fall action plan will be created and onward referrals to other fall prevention services can be completed if required.

We are also offering a **FREE** weekly strength and balance exercise class in Girton. FAME is the exercise programme which has been proven to improve strength, stability, and confidence in balance. It is a national programme, delivered by specialist, qualified instructors, who understand the age-related changes that occur in the body and the medical concerns you may have. The exercises are specifically developed to help keep you strong, steady, and doing the things you enjoy for longer. The classes are a great way to meet other people, receive support and build motivation.

Before accessing the class, you will be required to have a one-to-one appointment with the instructor to find out about your health and medications. You will also be asked to complete some simple functional tests to identify your starting point for exercise.

August Wine Selections

Whatever August has in store for us, here are three recommendations to tempt your palate this month.

Villa Maria EarthGarden Sauvignon Blanc 2020 (Marlborough)

Founded in 1962, Villa Maria is now New Zealand's most-awarded winery. The EarthGarden range is Villa Maria's first range of wines that are 100% organically grown, and this Sauvignon Blanc from the winery's Marlborough vineyards is deliciously fresh. Full of life, with aromas of apple, lime and pear, and flavours of lemon, peach, and passionfruit, this is a well-balanced wine with refreshing acidity and a lengthy finish. Perfect by itself on a warm summer's day, this will also pair very well with seafood, chicken, or plant-

based dishes, and is a wine that offers very good value for money.

CONSTANCIA

Finca Constancia Entre Lunas Organic Tempranillo 2019 (Castilla-la-Mancha)

Located near Toledo in Castilla-la-Mancha, the winery at Finca Constancia is a pioneer in biodynamic winemaking practices, and this very appealing red wine is 100% organic. It is made from indigenous Tempranillo grapes, which flourish in the long hot summers and the cooler winters of this region. This is a full-bodied wine, smooth, silky, and well-balanced, with medium tannins and a lengthy finish. It has been aged in oak for eight months, giving it a hint of smokiness in the background. Aromas of vanilla, blackcurrant, raspberry and plum on the nose

lead to raspberry, cherry, and damson, with hints of cloves and chocolate on the palate. This is a bold, expressive wine, which will go very well with a traditional roast lunch or a summer barbecue.

Freedom of the Press Bacchus 2021 (Oxfordshire)

This excellent Bacchus wine from Freedom of the Press winery, an urban winery located in the Cotswolds, is a recent discovery for me. With aromas of apple, pear, peach and blossom on the nose, and lemon, apple, pineapple, and grapefruit on the palate. Produced from grapes grown in Essex, principally the Crouch Valley, it is a well-balanced wine, with lively acidity and a smooth, lengthy finish. Enjoy by itself, with seafood, or with either sheep or goat cheese. It will also pair well with spicy Asian dishes.

Girton TownCharity

Community Warden provides valuable help for older residents

With the challenges of Covid and recent soaring temperatures, our AgeUK Community Warden Fiona has had a busy time ensuring all Village residents registered on the Scheme are being supported. Here she shares what she finds rewarding about her role.

Fiona says: "A typical day always starts with phone calls to all my service users so I can establish how they've been over the previous day and night and whether they need any shopping or other practical help. Following these calls, I can then plan my visits.

Checking in

"There are some people who like me to pop in every day whilst others prefer a longer visit once or twice a week whether they need anything or not.

"Even a phone call can make an enormous difference and when I visit, I often see the relief on their face when I say 'don't worry I can take care of this for you'. I like chatting to our users as they have had such interesting lives, as well as liaising with family if they don't live locally.

"We've all been through such difficult times with the Covid lockdown. Masks had to be worn and social distancing caused a problem with those hard of hearing. In the end I decided to wear a face shield which helped a lot. We weren't allowed to go into a house unless the person was very vulnerable and this was hard too. Everyone was very isolated.

Challenges

"Some of the challenges of my job are adapting to different personalities and getting to know what their needs are as it's often not apparent on early visits. Cognitive issues can also be an issue, particularly when I need to get in other agencies and neighbours to help.

"Having been in my role for five years now, I continue to enjoy the relationships I have built with our users. They know I'm there, trust me to do things for them and to liaise to with their families if needed. It creates a sense of well-being for all concerned and helps them to live without additional stress and worry."

Valued

Ann Bonnett, GTC Chair said: "As Trustees, we really value Fiona's work as our Community Warden and the skills she brings from AgeUK to the Scheme. We are delighted to fund this role as an important contribution to our community.

"We know from feedback that our residents really appreciate having her support and feel secure that someone will be in regular contact to check how they are doing and assist with any practical problems too."
