WHAT DO PARISH COUNCILS DO

Your Parish Council is part of Local Government and has responsibility for the wellbeing of your local community. Work falls into three main categories

- Delivery of Services
- · Improve quality of life for residents
- · Give communities a democrative voice

BECOMING A LOCAL COUNCILLOR

As a local councillor you an become a voice for your community and make real change. Councillors are community leaders and represent the interests of the communities they serve.

Local councillors have three main responsibilities:

- · Decision-making
- Monitoring
- Getting involved locally



GETTING ELECTED

To stand for election for a Parish Council you must be:

- A UK or Commonwealth citizen; or be a citizen of the Republic of Ireland; or be a citizen of another Member State of the European Union:
- At least 18 years old;
- an elector of the local council; or in the past 12 month occupied land or other premises in the area the local council serves (as owner or tenant); or work in the area local council serves (as your principal or only place of work); or live within three miles of the local council boundary
