

The last few weeks have been an extremely busy period for our council, staff and groundstaff teams as we hosted two large and important meetings for our community and our council:

- Girton Annual Parish Meeting A community meeting convened by Girton Parish Chairman, not a Parish Council meeting. An opportunity for our community to speak.
- Girton Parish Council Annual General Meeting –
 An annual re-set of our council for the next financial year. This year with the elections taking place in early May 2022, seven new councillors will be confirmed.

Annual Parish Meeting

Our Annual Parish Meeting took place on 11th May 2022, in the pavilion. Thank you to 49 attendees, our speakers Douglas de Lacey and Chris Jones and our support team including Linda Miller who did a great job serving refreshments.

Our chairman, Haydn Williams spoke about the staff changes, the progression of a number of projects and gave a big thank you to our outgoing councillors. He also confirmed that he would be stepping down as chair of Girton Parish Council at our Annual General Meeting on 17th May 2022.

At our Annual General Meeting on 17th May 2022, we welcomed our seven new councillors to Girton Parish Council. As you know every year, we are also required to elect a chair and vice chair to serve for the next year on the council. We are pleased to announce the election of Douglas de Lacey as our new chairman for the year 2022/2023. Congratulations also to our new vice chair Daniel Carney who has served on the council since late 2021. At our meeting many thanks were given to Dr Haydn Williams and Gill Cockley for their long service to the council.

In addition, our AGM continued to energise our committees with our councillors volunteering for the committees on which they believe they can make the most impact for the community.

Meeting with Girton Bowls Club, Girton Town Charity and Girton Parish Council

The above meeting took place on 6th May 2022 to consider the needs for affordable access to toilets by Bowls Green users. GTC have since made a written proposal for access to the William Collyn Centre and for consultation between the Bowls Club and an architect to discuss possibilities for provision of accessible toilets without full access to the William Collyn Centre.

Garden Society phone box vandalism

Finally, it is very sad to report that the Garden Society phone box display in Cambridge Road, has again been vandalised. This time a planter was extracted through the partially opened door and thrown into a neighbouring garden. Improvement in the door security and provision of stronger mesh netting of the windows will hopefully prevent a repetition.

Elections

Elections for SCDC were held on 5th May 2022. The sitting councillor, Corinne Garvie was returned. The new councillor is Richard Stobart. Richard is a retired professor of engineering and has particular interests in active travel, transport, access to the countryside and "green" energy. Richard is looking forward to working with the residents of Girton.

Ukraine

The latest data from the Department for Levelling Up, Housing and Communities and Home Office shows that 435 visas have been issued for South Cambridgeshire so far, as part of the Homes for Ukraine scheme. This is the highest number for any district council area, and the seventh highest figure for any area in England.

SCDC mobilised at short notice to arrange payments for guests and hosts, DBS checks and in-person visits to confirm properties are suitable, and guests are settling in well.

Additionally, an online welcome pack for new arrivals from Ukraine has been created and continues to be updated as further useful information becomes available.

Support for the homeless

Emmaus Cambridge, based in Landbeach, has been given a one-off grant of £30,000 which will allow it to employ an additional support worker to continue supporting single homeless people referred to the charity by SCDC.

SCDC's housing advice and options team provides free housing advice to everyone in South Cambridgeshire. through the history of drinking and pubs, David described how his family had come to buy the Queen's Head pub. June is the start of the blowsy season, when all the big over-the-top summer flowers make their first appearance. For a couple of months the garden looks like the top of a chocolate box (A. Titchmarsh, The Gardener's Year).

As I write this in mid-May, after the driest April for years, June seems to have arrived already - delphiniums, roses and clematis are blooming in some gardens, and lush growth is looking stressed from drought. Overall, weather patterns have been erratic this year, with storms, floods, snow at the end of a warm week, and the current long dry spell. Increasingly we face the challenge of how to "weatherproof" our gardens to improve resilience in extreme or unexpected weather conditions.

A basic rule for successful growing in all weathers is provided by Beth Chatto's well known maxim, "right plant, right place". Plants placed in their ideal soil and site conditions stand the best chance of survival. Moisture lovers in dry soil, sun lovers in shady nooks, and acid lovers in chalky soil will always struggle. While many plant casualties are caused by severe drought, the plant choices in Beth Chatto's famous dry garden show certain characteristics which convey some degree of natural drought tolerance. Features like silver, hairy, shiny, spiky or very small leaves for example and they are planted on slopes in gritty, well drained soil, so they never sit in wet that could kill them.

Drought, however, is a major threat to many plants, but there are practical measures which can help to supply and retain water during dry periods:

- storing water in as many water butts as possible, and routinely collecting cold water "run off" from kitchen hot taps, and "grey" water from washing up
- watering efficiently: direct to roots, not over leaves, in the early morning or evening to avoid rapid evaporation; thoroughly soaking trees and shrubs once a week to encourage deep rooting, but lightly watering annual bedding daily; using a drip hose system in borders or raised beds for consistency
- mulching borders deeply after spring rainfall, to conserve ground moisture
- placing saucers under pots to retain watering run off, and using pots with a built in reservoir and water retaining crystals in hanging baskets.

Besides drought the other main climate threats to plants are excessive wind, rain and cold. Some protection from these can be gained by:

- grouping pots together under house eaves or in the rain shadow of walls and fences
- raising pots off the ground to improve drainage
- bubble wrapping pots (not the plants) in very cold weather
- draping horticultural fleece over individual plants when frost is forecast
- protecting small plants with bell cloches (cut off plastic milk bottles will do)
- staking newly planted trees, and staking or confining perennials within plant supports, to avoid root rock/ wind damage.

Wild Girton – community comes together for nature

How can we help wildlife in Girton was front and centre of discussions at a well-attended community meeting on 18th May. The meeting heard from Parish Councillor Marcelo Lima about the development of a Local Nature Recovery Plan, which will be a mediumterm plan for the creation of more nature rich habitats in Girton. Dr Haydn Williams and Roger Mason gave an update on the work of Girton's Green Team, including a lovely tribute to the late George Thorpe, and Alison Giles presented for the Girton Allotment Society. The meeting also heard an inspiring story from Dry Drayton on how a community there has taken action to help swifts, with 50 swift nest boxes now in place on residents' homes and many nesting swifts!

The meeting then discussed the variety of habitats and species already in Girton and the opportunities and aspirations for their enhancement. From hedgehogs and great crested newts to tree planting and ponds, there were some great ideas and stimulating discussion on how we can enhance biodiversity in Girton. The group noted the importance of providing corridors for wildlife through the village such as hedgerows, of education and working with schools, and the importance of wider community engagement. It was inspiring to hear stories of actions already taken by residents to help biodiversity.

The next steps will be to compile all the great ideas that were raised, to conduct further consultation with the community on wildlife in Girton, and to explore funding opportunities. Another meeting will be held in the summer to bring it all together and start to shape Girton's Local Nature Recovery Plan, turning ideas into action!





Open Studios runs over the four weekends in July and Jenny will be welcoming visitors on the first and third weekends.



Topping Out ceremony signals new high at Dovehouse Court

Construction of the new almshouses at Dovehouse Court on the High Street reached a major milestone recently when a Topping Out ceremony was held on-site.

Representatives from Girton Town Charity, Barnes Construction, Northmores and Mole Architects assembled for the symbolic placement of the final ridge tile on the

bungalow block to signify the completion of the build phase.

The next stage will be the installation of all the internal fixtures and fittings over the forthcoming six months, including electrics and plumbing.

The project is on schedule with a completion date before the end of the year.

Energy-efficiency

Dovehouse Court. which will comprise

15 almshouses and a new office for the Charity, is being built to stringent Passivhaus standards achieved through high levels of insulation.

This results in low energy costs and improved indoor air quality, all made possible by installing energy-efficient windows and doors, with stricter levels of airtightness, mechanical ventilation and heat recovery.

Internal works

Ann Bonnett, Chair of GTC said: "It is excellent news that we have finished the build phase at Dovehouse Court and have marked the occasion with a Topping Out ceremony. The teams working on the project will now be focusing on the internal aspects of the build.

"We are working to a completion date before the end of this year and looking forward to welcoming back our residents from Michael's Close who we hope will be in their new homes for Christmas.

"At the start of 2023 we will be inviting applications from Girton residents over 55 or those who have a close connection to the Village, with the plan to implement a series of phased appointments in the early months of the year."

A celebration of English and Welsh wines

As we celebrate the Queen's Platinum Jubilee, there are two more great reasons to crack open a bottle or two in June. Welsh Wine Week (4-12 June) and English Wine Week (18-26 June). Here are a few suggestions to tempt your palate!



Winbirri Solaris 2020 (Norfolk)

Winbirri Vineyard near Norwich is well-known for its award-winning wines and produces a range of still and sparkling wines.

The Solaris 2020 is a smooth, refreshing, slightly off-dry wine with medium acidity and a lengthy finish. With elderflower, apple and peach on the nose, and honey and nectarine on the palate, the wine also has its own character which distinguishes it from a Sauvignon Blanc, Chardonnay or Bacchus.

If you are looking for an appealing wine to go with your seafood or chicken dish, this is certainly one to try.



Ancre Hill Estates Rosé 2018 (Monmouthshire)

Although we might automatically think of France when we think of rosé, there are plenty of other wine regions around the world producing some fine examples, including this one from Wales.

This is a well-balanced wine with lots of flavour and a lively acidity. Pale pink with a tinge of yellow in colour, it has aromas of strawberry, bramble, apple and grapefruit on the nose, and flavours of strawberry, rhubarb, cream soda and grapefruit on the palate.

A crisp, fresh wine with low alcohol which is perfect by itself and also goes well with canapés or fish, particularly oily fish.



Halfpenny Green Penny Red NV (Staffordshire)

This recent discovery is a fine example of a wine produced in the heart of the Black Country in the West Midlands. One of the largest vineyards in the country with almost 30 acres, Halfpenny Green benefits from well-sheltered south-facing slopes and light, sandy free-draining soil to grow a wide variety of grapes.

A smooth, velvety, well-balanced wine it has aromas of bramble, cherry and blackcurrant, and flavours of blackberry, damson and plum. A wine to enjoy by itself

or with lamb or cheese.



White Castle Vineyard Pinot Noir Reserve 2019 (Monmouthshire)

This is a very impressive wine from White Castle Vineyard, located near Abergavenny in Wales.

A combination of the Black Mountains, the three local rivers, the relatively low levels of rainfall, the clay and loamy soil, and the gently sloping, south-facing aspect of the vineyard all converge to create a unique micro-climate.

This is a light, well-balanced wine with aromas of red berries and vanilla, and a

hint of oak and smokiness on the nose, and flavours of raspberry, cherry and blackberry on the palate, it's the perfect match for Welsh lamb, duck or a cheese platter.

Church can change your perspective



For better, for worse (but hopefully for better)

One of the great joys of coming out of Covid has been to start doing full marriage services again. The gathering together of family and friends as two people are joined together in matrimony is both a joy and a blessing. And, just in case you didn't know, anyone resident in the village is entitled to be married in the church!

However, if you've been married four months, four years or even four decades you'll be aware that marriages, like all healthy relationships, need work and time to keep them strong. It's easy for a couple to drift apart. It's easy for circumstances to change, for harder times to come and for things to fall apart as a result. Just as a car needs regular servicing it can be helpful for a marriage to have a regular "check-up".

That's why St Andrew's Church is running **The Marriage Course** this summer. In marriage we promise "for better, for worse" and this course is intended to make marriages "for better" - it's a bit like an MOT for your married life. Over seven weeks you'll have an opportunity to spend time with your spouse and to talk over some of the common things that might cause a marriage to run less smoothly. Sessions include "Strengthening Connection", "The Art of Communication", "The Power of Forgiveness" and more.

The Marriage Course is all online so you don't have to go anywhere. Each week you choose a convenient time to get together with your spouse, perhaps get some wine or snacks, and watch the video that I'll email to you (most are 105 mins). Each week there's some input with activities and conversation-starters to help you talk and listen to each other.

No-one else will know that you're even doing the course. It's just between you and your spouse as a space to talk and take stock of where you are as a couple.


The Churchyard Gardening Group
